Did You Know?

Ten million Americans have Noise-Induced Hearing Loss.

Daily, about 30 million Americans are exposed to dangerous noise.

Roughly 13 out of every 100 school children have some degree of hearing loss.

Children with mild or unilateral (one ear) hearing loss have difficulty with their educational, social, and speech development. Among African-American, Cuban-American, Mexican-American, Puerto Rican and non-Hispanic White children, approximately 391,000 school-aged children have hearing loss in at least one ear.

Noise-Induced Hearing Loss (NIHL) is caused by exposure to loud sounds and usually occurs painlessly over a period of time, but may occur from one exposure to an extremely loud noise. Research suggests that NIHL is occurring at younger ages and with more frequency. Noise from personal headphones, jet skis, concerts, lawn equipment, power tools, firecrackers, household appliances, toys and musical instruments all have the potential to cause hearing loss. NIHL can be prevented.
