# VISION

## Instruction Delivery Models

### Remote Learning

Remote Learning is an extension of In-School Learning. This delivery model will occur if a student becomes sick during the school year, a classroom or school building must close, the district closes all school buildings, or the governor orders a school shutdown. Students will receive school work from their teacher via Google Classroom or Schoology and students will have opportunities to interact with staff and students online.

### In-School Learning

This delivery model is a full return of students and staff to school buildings with the option of virtual learning. Students who return to the physical buildings will have face-to-face instruction, access to classes such as band and orchestra, recess, and lunch in the cafeteria. Safety protocols will be in place, including required masks and sanitization measures.

### Virtual Learning

This delivery model is for students in grades K-12 who choose not to attend school during the school day. Virtual students will be totally online for their school work. Students must commit for an entire semester. Virtual Learning at Middletown City Schools provides a more flexible approach to learning, but requires students to be self-motivated. Students are generally able to work at their own pace (asynchronously) to complete online work, usually through a program such as School PLP (K-5) and APEX (6-12 program). Teachers will monitor student work, provide necessary support, and provide office hours for student/parent questions.

#### **You have options**

We recognize some students may be unable to attend school in-person due to either medical reasons or personal family choice. We know this is a difficult decision and we respect your choice. We will work with you and your student so their education can continue during the pandemic.

# STUDENT ROLES & RESPONSIBILITIES

## TIPS FOR SUCCESS

- Find a quiet place at home for schoolwork
- Create a schedule for yourself (bedtime, snack time, play time, etc.) and stick with it!
- Create a schedule for completing your school work and stick with it!
- Ask for help when needed! Don't hesitate to reach out to your teacher(s) when you have a question or concern.
- Read for 20 minutes every day!

- The device you are assigned must be charged and ready for use at school and at home everyday.
- Log into your online platform (K-5, Google Classroom or 6-12, Schoology) daily for information, assignments and resources. Virtual students 6-12 will use Apex
- During remote learning or virtual learning your attendance is tracked by your daily activity in the courses you are enrolled in, daily participation is required.
- Keep track of your usernames and passwords.
- When at home, find a place that you can study and do homework. Participate in online assignments and use digital resources provided by your teacher(s).
- Submit all assignments by the due dates set by your teachers.
- Advocate for yourself by asking questions when you don't understand (email your teacher).
- During remote learning:
  - **ELEMENTARY** students will follow the class schedule:
    - Mon.- ELA/Elective,
    - Tues.- Math/Elective,
    - Wed.- Science/Elective,
    - Thurs.- Soc. Studies/Elective,
    - Friday- Intervention/Enrichment/Elective.
    - *In the morning the teacher provides instruction, afternoon time is for class assignments, group work and providing support.*
  - **SECONDARY** students (6-12) will follow a bell schedule: In the morning, students receive instruction; afternoons are used for class assignments and group/individual support. (5 hour day).
- **Virtual Learning**, your teacher will set up a schedule with you.
- Ask for HELP during the school day 8-11 AM and 12:30-3:30 PM by emailing your teacher
- Guidelines set forth in the [Code of Conduct](#) are expected whether in the brick and mortar setting or if the student is utilizing distance learning.

## Work Submission and Grading

Students are expected to meet deadlines as set forth by their classroom teacher. Completion of coursework will ultimately factor into grading. Please set a schedule for completing work and stick with it! Work can be submitted either through Google Classroom, Schoology, or APEX depending on the platform used by the classroom teacher. Please contact your teacher if you have questions about submission.

## Grading and Reporting

K-12 will utilize ProgressBook as the master gradebook. Parents and students have access to student's grades through the district portal found on the MCSD web site. Parents will have access to their 6-12 Schoology or Apex courses. The district grading scale will be used for all learning situations. Students will receive progress reports and final grades as in the past. High school courses will be given credit for passing grades.
